


### GROSS NATIONAL PRODUCT AT CURRENT FACTOR COST PRICES




# GROSS NATIONAL PRODUCT AT CONSTANT (1959) FACTOR COST PRICES


## GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT BY INDUSTRIAL ORIGIN AT CURRENT FACTOR COST PRICES

### GROSS NATIONAL EXPENDITURE AT CURRENT MARKET PRICES






#### PRODUCTION OF PRINCIPAL AGRICULTURAL CROPS




This chart indicates the origin of Money supply in Sri Lanka.



#### GOVERNMENT REVENUE & EXPENDITURE





#### GOVT. NET CASH SURPLUS OR DEFICIT



### COMPOSITION OF PUBLIC DEBT (SHOWING GROSS & NET\* PUBLIC DEBT)



#### OWNERSHIP OF PUBLIC DEBT





#### EXTERNAL ASSETS OF SRI LANKA





#### MERCHANDISE EXPORTS & IMPORTS




## VALUE OF EXPORTS & IMPORTS BY COMMODITY GROUPS

# BALANCE OF TRADE BY TRADING BLOCS AND OTHER GROUPS END OF YEAR FIGURES





1967=100











## WAGE RATE INDEX NUMBERS 1952=100


