
Weekly Economic Indicators

19th March 2021





Highlights of the Week

Real Sector

The GDP contracted by 3.6 per cent in real terms in 2020. Industry, Agriculture and Services activities contracted by 6.9 per cent, 2.4 per cent and 1.5 per cent, respectively. Further, Taxes less subsidies on products contracted by 8.0 per cent during the year.

Purchasing Managers' Indices for both Manufacturing and Services activities expanded in February 2021, recording 59.4 and 56.5 respectively, with the normalisation of business activities.

During the period under review (13.03.2021 to 19.03.2021), crude oil prices largely showed a declining trend. Prices declined mainly due to clouded expectations on recovery in fuel demand as the new wave of COVID-19 outbreak spreading across Europe caused new lockdowns. Price decrease was further supported by the rise in US crude inventories. Overall, Brent and WTI prices fell by US dollars 6.19 per barrel and US dollars 5.97 per barrel, respectively, during the period.

Monetary Sector

Weekly AWPR for the week ending 19th March 2021 increased by 07 bps to 5.61 per cent compared to the previous week.

The reserve money increased compared to the previous week mainly due to the increase in currency in circulation and deposits held by the commercial banks with the Central Bank.

The total outstanding market liquidity was a surplus of Rs. 119.175 bn by the end of this week, compared to a surplus of Rs. 181.377 bn by the end of last week.

By 19th March 2021, the All Share Price Index (ASPI) decreased by 5.42 per cent to 6,854.32 points and the S&P SL 20 Index decreased by 4.70 per cent to 2,757.45 points, compared to the index values of last week.

External Sector

During the year up to 19th March 2021 the Sri Lankan rupee depreciated against the US dollar (6.5 per cent). Given the cross currency exchange rate movements, the Sri Lankan rupee depreciated against the pound sterling (8.3 per cent), the Indian rupee (7.1 per cent), the Euro (3.3 per cent) and the Japanese yen (1.1 per cent) during this period.
