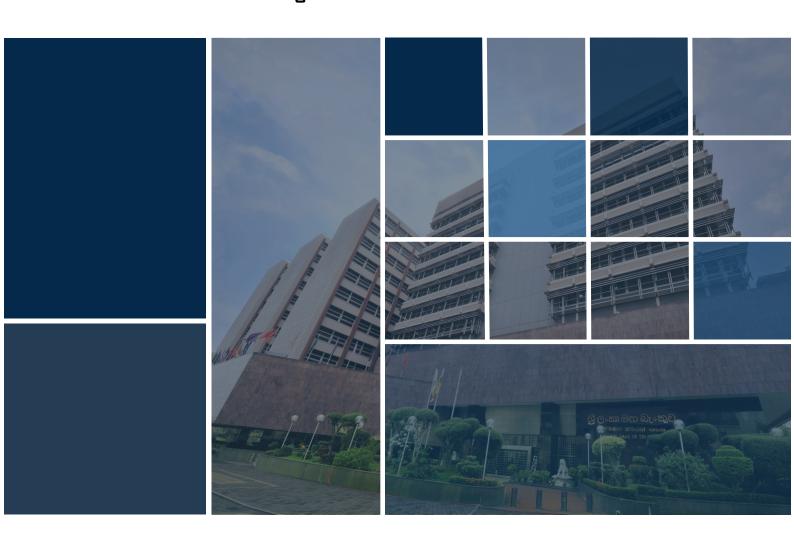
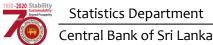
Weekly Economic Indicators

13th August 2021





Highlights of the Week

Real Sector

The IIP in June 2021 has increased by 5.1 per cent to 97.2 compared to June 2020. Among the major sub divisions of the manufacturing industries, "Rubber and plastic products" (90.2 per cent) and "Other non-metallic mineral products" (28.7 per cent) have mainly contributed to this overall increase.

During the period under review (07.08.2021 to 13.08.2021), crude oil prices showed a mixed performance. At the beginning of the week, crude oil prices rose after the US Government policy decision to abstain from asking major US producers to boost output. A decline in US crude oil inventories also supported the price increase. However, at the end of the week, prices fell as demand growth for crude oil and its products sharply dropped as surging cases of COVID-19 resulted in reimposition of mobility restrictions across countries. Overall, both Brent and WTI prices increased by US dollars 1.49 per barrel and US dollars 1.67 per barrel, respectively, during the period.



Monetary Sector

Weekly AWPR for the week ending 13th August 2021 decreased by 1 bp to 5.71 per cent compared to the previous week

The reserve money increased compared to the previous week mainly due to the increase in currency in circulation.

The total outstanding market liquidity was a surplus of Rs. 15.488 bn by the end of this week, compared to a surplus of Rs. 48.322 bn by the end of last week.

By 13th August 2021, the All Share Price Index (ASPI) decreased by 1.27 per cent to 7,996.04 points and the S&P SL 20 Index decreased by 2.13 per cent to 2,990.91 points, compared to the index values of last week.



External Sector

During the year up to 13th August 2021, the Sri Lankan rupee depreciated against the US dollar by 6.8 per cent. Given the cross currency exchange rate movements, the Sri Lankan rupee depreciated against the pound sterling by 7.9 per cent, the Indian rupee by 5.4 per cent, the Euro by 2.3 per cent and the Japanese yen by 0.1 per cent during this period.

The gross official reserves were estimated at US dollars 2,833.5 mn as at end July 2021.

Earnings from exports increased by 29.1 per cent (year-on-year) to US dollars 5,699 mn during the first half of 2021 as a result of increased earnings from exports of textiles and garments (28.0%), rubber products (48.8%) and machinery and mechanical appliances (65.3%). Import expenditure increased significantly by 30.5 per cent (year-on-year) to US dollars 10,014.7 mn during the first half of 2021, largely due to higher imports of fuel (43.7%), textile and textile articles (36.2%) and machinery and equipment (38.0%). Accordingly, the deficit in the trade account widened to US dollars 4,315.7 mn during the first half of 2021 from US dollars 3,261.8 mn in the corresponding period of 2020.

The export unit value index increased by 3.4 per cent (year-on-year) in June 2021 mainly due to higher prices registered in industrial and mineral exports. The import unit value index in June 2021 increased by 24.1 per cent (year-on-year) due to higher prices recorded in all major categories of imports. Accordingly, the terms of trade decreased by 16.7 per cent (year-on-year) to 88.4 index points in June 2021.

The average price of tea (in the Colombo auction) decreased to US dollars 2.93 per kg in June 2021 from US dollars 3.31 per kg in June 2020.
